



In Puerto Rico, access to a decent, affordable home should not be a privilege, it should be everyone's right. Having a home means stability, security and hope. Our mission is to transform and expand access to housing across the island, and in 2024 we had the honor of walking 7 families through the path to their first home. Our role is crucial: influencing the affordable-housing ecosystem in Puerto Rico and creating the conditions that allow families who would otherwise have no chance at homeownership to secure a place of their own. What we do, not only opens the door to permanent housing; it also improves living conditions and quality of life, creating a positive impact that will be felt for generations, one home at a time.



Affordable housing is essential to Puerto Rico's social and economic progress. It directly affects stability, health, education, well-being and upward mobility for thousands of families. A safe, stable home is more than a physical space; it is the foundation from which people can build secure lives, pursue better educational and job opportunities, accumulate wealth and ultimately achieve a higher quality of life.

Housing costs continue to rise while household incomes do not keep pace, leaving many families increasingly insecure about where they live.

From an economic standpoint, limited access to affordable housing is a barrier to sustainable development: it lowers labor productivity, raises public-health and social-service costs, and hampers Puerto Rico's ability to attract and retain local talent, among other critical effects.

Prioritizing affordable housing is not just a matter of social justice; it is a strategic cornerstone for inclusive, resilient economic growth in Puerto Rico.





At Habitat for Humanity of Puerto Rico, we believe that a safe, stable, and affordable home is the foundation for building strong families and resilient communities. Since our founding, we have worked to create meaningful change by providing individuals and families with the opportunity to achieve stability, self-sufficiency, and a better quality of life through access to affordable housing and specialized capacity-building programs.

We recognize that a home is more than just four walls and a roof — it's where futures are shaped, dreams are built, and dignity is restored. Every family deserves the chance to live in a secure and healthy environment, and through our efforts, we aim to make that a reality for more people in Puerto Rico.

Housing Situation in Puerto Rico

For the year 2024, the Affordable Housing Index published by Estudios Técnicos Inc. once again reflected a clear, unbroken downward trend in overall housing affordability across Puerto Rico. The data confirm that, at prevailing income levels, most consumers still earn too little to purchase a home priced at today's average market cost. Taken together, the weakening index values, the persistent rise in property prices, the acute shortage of reasonably priced housing units, and the continued escalation in construction expenses combine to create a multifaceted—and deeply troubling—landscape. This environment poses particularly severe challenges for households in the low- to middle-income brackets who aspire to become homeowners, underscoring just how difficult it has become to turn that aspiration into reality.



Housing Costs Increase

Average home prices increased by

25%

from \$179.649 in Q12023 to \$224,484 in Q12024.



New home prices rose

from \$262.301 in Q12023 to \$357,492 in Q12024.



Used home prices increased

24%

from \$173,114 to \$214,304.



Mortgage interest rate hikes have contributed to a **decline in home sales** from

3,326 units

in Q12021 to **2,255 units** in Q12024.





How Habitat Responds

Through our comprehensive Homeownership Program, we open the door for a growing number of individuals and families to attain the security and pride that come with owning a home—making the uninterrupted continuation of our initiatives across Puerto Rico absolutely vital.

To achieve this, we forge purposeful partnerships with financial institutions, community-based organizations, and multiple tiers of government, working hand in hand to devise and implement pragmatic, long-lasting solutions that directly address housing needs on the island.

At the same time, we champion public awareness of Puerto Rico's deepening housing crisis and actively advocate for policies that expand access to truly affordable housing, ensuring that every resident—especially those most vulnerable—has a fair opportunity to build a stable, dignified future.



Homeownership Program

At Habitat for Humanity of Puerto Rico, our overarching mission is to **cultivate strength, stability, and lasting self-sufficiency** within our communities by expanding tangible pathways to affordable homeownership. We focus on serving individuals and families whose incomes fall within the low- to moderate-income range. When these prospective homeowners meet our eligibility criteria and secure approval for a Habitat mortgage, they can enter into a dynamic partnership with us to transform their long-held dream of owning a home into a concrete reality.

To participate in our Homeownership Program, applicants must:



Demonstrate an authentic need for adequate housing—whether due to overcrowding, unsafe living conditions, or an unsustainable rental cost burden.



Show capacity to repay a mortgage offered at 0% interest, thereby ensuring long-term affordability and financial sustainability.



Commit to partnering actively with Habitat for Humanity of Puerto Rico, a collaboration that typically includes completing "sweat-equity" volunteer hours and engaging in financial-literacy or homeowner-readiness workshops.

During the most recent year, Habitat Puerto Rico accelerated the path to homeownership by supporting families enrolled in the Puerto Rico Department of Housing's R3 Program (Repair, Reconstruction, and Relocation). This strategic collaboration broadened access to safe, affordable housing and increased the number of R3-registered households able to secure a home of their own, reinforcing our commitment to opening more doors—literally and figuratively—for families across the island.

Women Build **Puerto Rico**

The Women Build Puerto Rico program is an initiative that aims to train and **empower women** by teaching them basic home repair skills. Through hands-on workshops, participants gain essential knowledge that strengthens their independence and self-confidence.

In collaboration with Hogar Ruth,

20 women received training in basic repair workshops.

These sessions covered fundamental skills in electricity and plumbing, essential tools for improving their homes and reinforcing their self-sufficiency.



Capacity Building

Through a robust series of capacity-building training programs, Habitat for Humanity of Puerto Rico provides aspiring homeowners with the knowledge and confidence they need to thrive. Participants attend hands-on, instructor-led workshops that cover budgeting, credit management, and long-term financial planning—skills that underpin successful homeownership. In addition, we deliver basic home-maintenance training, teaching everything from routine repairs to preventive care, so families can safeguard their investment and foster a safe, healthy living environment. These educational sessions, along with other tailored topics, lay the groundwork for lasting stability and self-sufficiency.

Homebuyer Education Program

We offer an end-to-end learning pathway that guides selected families through every stage of the purchasing journey:

Financial Education Courses

Pre and Post Purchase Guidance

Home **Maintenance Training**

By combining rigorous financial instruction with practical maintenance know-how, we prepare families and individuals to become responsible, sustainable homeowners—building personal equity while strengthening neighborhoods across Puerto Rico.

Playhouse School Program

As part of the pilot program,

students from Colegio San Ignacio de Loyola

participated in a unique educational experience. Their objective was to develop a project focused on learning skills and knowledge about the need for affordable housing in Puerto Rico.

As a result, the students designed and built a playhouse for the children of Nuestra Escuela in Loíza, applying what they learned in carpentry, finance, plumbing, and electricity workshops. They also carried out a fundraising strategy.

Sucess Story •

My daughter and I used to live in a house made of wood and zinc, which

lost its entire roof due to Hurricane Maria.

This then caused a chain reaction that damaged the floor, and after several rains over the years, things only got worse. The Department of Housing informed us that the house was uninhabitable and that we needed to relocate.

We learned about Habitat Puerto Rico

and began the process to get a home with them. When we found out we had been selected, we cried together, we were so happy and grateful for this great achievement for us. Being able to offer my daughter a beautiful concrete home

brings me happiness and peace of mind.

We no longer have to look for a shelter or go to someone else's house during weather emergencies here, we will be safe and at peace








Where We Are Headed
